QUARTER 3 AND SEMESTER 2 DROP/ADD

It's hard to believe, but we are almost at the halfway point for the 2020-2021 school year! The start of Quarter 3 and Semester 2 is January 28th. Most students will have significant schedule changes, as all 0.5 credit and 1.0 credit classes will change over.

As a reminder students may view their schedule online at any time through the Powerschool student portal. If you would like a paper copy of your schedule, your HomeBase teacher will have one for you when you return from December break.

Please note that most appointments will be scheduled virtually. Upon the scheduling of your appointment Ms. Ward will ask for a student's cell phone as the counselor may need to call your student to remind them of their appointment. ATTENTION CHS FAMILIES OF 9TH AND 10TH GRADE STUDENTS!

As you begin to think about your academic program for next year you may want to consider attending one of our Technical Centers. The Center for Technology at Essex (CTE) offers programs to students entering 10th, 11th and 12th grade while the Burlington Technical Center (BTC) offers programs to students entering 11th and 12th grade. Students who attend CTE typically attend a full day while students at BTC attend a half day.

SCHEDULING 2020-2021

Lakers: January 25, HB: Program of Studies and Talking Points: Champs: January 28 HB: Program of Studies and Talking Points: The purpose of this is to provide time for students to read and review the CHS Program of Studies.

During this Homebase teachers read and review with students "Talking Points" from each department area. The talking points highlight key points that students need to know about each department's course catalog.

Reviewing the transcript is important for two reasons: it allows us to catch computer errors, as well as reminding students of what they have already taken. As students review their transcript they will work with their Homebase teacher to complete the 4 year credit check form. It is very important that students have time to review the transcript and complete this form prior to course registration as it helps your student determine what courses to take for the following year.

The paper forms are designed to make the online registration easier. It also provides think time to students so that when they are ready to electronically sign up the process is more efficient and accurate

Please note that students will register electronically for classes during the third week in February. You will be able to view their course requests in Parent Portal. You will NOT be able to see the students ACTUAL schedule until they are mailed home this summer by guidance.


Any student who is absent will be registered by a guidance counselor. All students who attend one of our technical centers or are a virtual learner will be registered by their school counselor virtually during the month of February.



Web-based/Online Resources

This is where we're looking at websites, blogs, and other content available on the internet.

Benefits of online resources:

- . An online search can easily yield a large list of results (this can be a blessing and a curse)
- · Good web resources can quickly point you or link you to additional resources

NOTE: It's very important to evaluate web-based resources for accuracy and credibility. Remember, anyone can make and post a website!

Primary Sources

You can find primary sources online, in print resources, or in our Library databases. Primary sources are things like firsthand accounts (letters, diary entries, historic photographs, etc.) as well as things like original study findings.

Interviews

Interviews are a great kind of primary

source. Depending on your research topic, you may find that there are experts in the field or people who lived through a particular time or event who are willing to chat with you and answer some of your questions.

Benefits of interviews:

- · Ask your follow-up questions and get answers




CSD FAMILY NIGHTS
