

Dear CHS Families,

Happy March! We hope you are enjoying the longer days and (sometimes) warmer weather.

As we approach spring we are thinking about the last few months our seniors have at CHS! We have formed a Senior Group consisting of students and faculty to brainstorm and plan events to celebrate the senior class this spring. Our first meeting is this Friday. Seniors - stay tuned for more information!

Each year CHS administers the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBAC) in Math and English Language Arts to all 9th grade students as well as the Vermont State Science Assessment (VTSA) to all 11th graders. Please see THIS letter from the district about the assessments. At this time the state has not given us any indication that we will be exempt from administering the assessments this year (last year all districts were exempt from the federally and state mandated spring assessments). To minimize the impact on students in-person instruction time, we are planning on administering the tests on the first two Wednesdays in April. On Wednesday, April 7th all 9th graders will come to CHS to take the Math SBAC from 7:45am-11:30am and on Wednesday April 14th all 9th graders will come to CSH to take the ELA SBAC and all 11th graders will come to CHS to take the VTSA from 7:45am-12:00pm. There will be no remote classes on those days. Normal bus runs will be offered on both those days to transport students to CHS and back home. We will provide more information in the April 1st Laker View.
