#### **COVID and Potential Remote Plan**

We know that the new year has brought on some additional COVID stressors for many families. As you can imagine, we are seeing an increase in the number of student and employee absences, and believe this trend will continue for the near future. We are hopeful we will be able continue to stay open for in-person learning, but also recognize the importance of having a remote plan if necessary. #### 2022-2023 Registration Begins!

During the month of January, every Colchester High School teacher will be speaking with your student and recommending to them potential courses for next school year. Current CHS students will register during the month of February during Homebase. Students who currently attend Burlington Technical Center or Essex Technical Center as well as our virtual students will also register for classes during the month of February through their school counselor.

At the end of March CHS will mail home a listing of courses that your student has requested. We ask that you review their list of courses, and please call CHS if you have any concerns. The student's schedule for 2022-2023 will be distributed during the summer. If you have any questions regarding the CHS registration process please call school counseling at 264-5713.

## CHS MIDTERM EXAMINATIONS JANUARY 2022

During examination week, students are required to attend school during their class examination period. Students are welcome to use their non-examination periods to study for exams in the cafeteria. In addition, the gymnasium will be available for open gym for those who choose to participate from 8:00-12:00. The buses will run in the morning as usual, and they will do the run at 12:30PM instead of 2:20PM. Students may not remain at school in the afternoon unless they have administrative approval.

It is very important that your student attend the scheduled examination. Failure to take the examination in a course will result in failure and/or loss of credit in the course. If the student is sick and will not be present at the exam, a parent/guardian must call the office and notify Ms. Etienne. If the student arrives late, he/she must report to the Assistant Principal. Late admission is not automatic, and in fact, will be denied unless the student has proof of a valid reason for the late arrival.

- Please be reminded that on these days students arrive at school at the usual time.
- Exams begin promptly at 8:00AM. Students will NOT be admitted late.
- Students must leave after their last exam. There will be bus service at 12:30PM.
- Students should not come to school on the makeup day unless they have scheduled a makeup exam through the teacher and an administrator.
- Mr. DeMagistris or Ms. LeClair MUST approve all makeup exams due to an absence.
- If your student will be absent, please contact Ms. Etienne at **264-5711**.
- Students may not remain at school in the afternoon unless they have administrative approval.

#### What if school is delayed two hours on an exam day?

If school is delayed by two hours, then the normally scheduled examinations would still occur, but the times would change. The first exam would run from 9:45AM - 11:45AM. The second exam would run from 12:20PM - 2:20PM. Buses will pick students up two hours later than normal. At 2:20PM buses will follow the normal end of day schedule.

#### What if school is canceled completely due to bad weather?

If school is canceled due to bad weather during examinations, then the normally scheduled examination will occur the next day. For example, if Monday was scheduled to be the A1 & A3 exams and school was canceled on Monday, then Tuesday morning would become the scheduled time for the A1 & A3 examinations.

#### **INTERMITTENT CLOSURE AND REMOTE PLAN**

If CHS needs to close for a short period of time, the following information will serve to guide the decision making about the school day schedule and instruction while remote. Specific details about the closure will be communicated to students, teachers, staff, and families from the CHS administration and CSD Central office. We've developed this schedule to allow for movement from in-person to remote learning with the least amount of educational impact possible. Teachers may need to adjust <u>Weekly Learning Plans</u> for the week to make the switch from in person to remote learning. All links to Zoom classes and Office Hours can be found on the teacher's <u>Weekly Learning Plans</u>.

#### A DAY/B DAY

We will follow the regular A day/B day rotation. See the <u>A Day/B Day calendar</u>.

#### HOMEBASE (HB) AND AT

We will not hold traditional HB/AT while remote. Teachers will hold office hours in the afternoon for support.

#### **OFFICE HOURS**

Each teacher will have office hours each day from 1:20 - 2:20 pm. Teachers will have an open Zoom link for office hours posted on the teacher's <u>Weekly Learning Plan</u>. Students can go to any of their teachers for office hours (A or B day teachers).

Please note: Any parent/guardian communication should happen outside of office hours for privacy and confidentiality reasons.

## SCHEDULING 2022-2023

#### January 24: 45 minute homebase :Program of Studies and Talking Points:

## The purpose of this is to provide time for students to read and review the CHS Program of Studies.

During this Homebase teachers read and review with students "Talking Points" from each department area. The talking points highlight key points that students need to know about each department's course catalog.

#### January 31: 45 minute HB: 4 Year Credit Check and A/B Day Grid:

## The purpose of this HB is to give students the opportunity to review their CHS transcript.

Reviewing the transcript is important for two reasons: it allows us to catch computer errors, as well as reminding students of what they have already taken. As students review their transcript they will work with their Homebase teacher to complete the 4 year credit check form. It is very important that students have time to review the transcript and complete this form prior to course registration as it helps your student determine what courses to take for the following year.

#### February 7: 45 Minute HB: Registration (PAPER)

## The purpose of this HB is to have students sign up for next year's classes on a paper form.

The paper forms are designed to make the online registration easier. It also provides think time to students so that when they are ready to electronically sign up the process is more efficient and accurate

#### **Electronic Registration:**

Please note that students will register electronically for classes during the second week in February. You will be able to view their course requests in Parent Portal. You will NOT be able to see the students ACTUAL schedule until they are mailed home this summer by guidance. Any student who is absent will be registered by a school counselor. All students who attend one of our technical centers will be registered at their respective schools prior to February break.

## SECOND SEMESTER ADD/DROP

As a reminder students may view their schedule online at any time through the powerschool student portal. If you would like a paper copy of your schedule, your HomeBase teacher will have one for you when you return from December break.

School counseling will begin to schedule appointments starting **Wednesday, January 12** for add/drop. Appointments are limited and are scheduled on a first come basis to the schedule listed below. Appointments are made by coming into the school counseling office or by calling Ms. Ward directly at 264-5713. *Please do not leave a message requesting a time as appointments are limited. Please call back until you get a live voice.*

I, along with all of our student athletes, would like to thank everyone for their continued support of Colchester High School Athletics. As you are attending events please keep in mind the following statement from the the VPA:

The Vermont Principals' Association, the Vermont Superintendents Association, and the Vermont School Athletic Directors Association require participants and spectators to behave in a respectful manner. Sportsmanship and a safe playing environment are the top priorities for all Vermont school-sponsored activities. Vermont law requires learning environments free from hazing, harassment, and bullying of any kind. This is especially true with respect to a person's race, gender, sexual orientation, religion, national origin, ethnic differences, or disability. Under no circumstances should any student athletes, officials, or coaches, be subjected to behavior and/or language aimed to demean, disrespect or harm. If behavior or hate speech of this kind is observed and/or reported, the officials will stop the event immediately to meet with the coaches and the site administrator about the next course of action. Possible outcomes of violating this expectation include:

- An immediate ejection from the event
- Ending the event early and returning home
- Possible forfeiture of the event or future events
- Resuming the game without fans
- Scheduling future games without fans
- Restrictions/suspensions from future attendance/participation

Adults and student athletes are encouraged and expected to work together to ensure a meaningful and safe learning environment for our communities to grow and thrive together. Thank you to all participants for helping ensure the highest levels of respect and safety for all.

  scavenger hunt; the answer to these questions can be discovered by visiting the exhibit tables.
  Collectively, this allows youth to learn about different kinds of engineering and career pathways.
  There will also be a robotics demonstration by some of the FIRST Robotics teams.
- In the afternoon participants will continue to connect with engineering professionals and UVM engineering students through **hands-on skill-building workshops**.
