



The intent of this document is to outline for you how students will register for classes and what role homebase teachers have registering students.


You will see in our timeline that homebase teachers will guide students through three extended homebase sessions.

SCHEDULING 2022-2023

January 24: 45 minute homebase :Program of Studies and Talking Points:

The purpose of this is to provide time for students to read and review the CHS Program of Studies.

During this Homebase teachers read and review with students “Talking Points” from each department area. The talking points highlight key points that students need to know about each department’s course catalog.

January 31: 45 minute HB: 4 Year Credit Check and A/B Day Grid:

The purpose of this HB is to give students the opportunity to review their CHS transcript.

Reviewing the transcript is important for two reasons: it allows us to catch computer errors, as well as reminding students of what they have already taken. As students review their transcript they will work with their Homebase teacher to complete the 4 year credit check form. It is very important that students have time to review the transcript and complete this form prior to course registration as it helps your student determine what courses to take for the following year.

February 7: 45 Minute HB: Registration (PAPER)

The purpose of this HB is to have students sign up for next year’s classes on a paper form.

The paper forms are designed to make the online registration easier. It also provides think time to students so that when they are ready to electronically sign up the process is more efficient and accurate

Electronic Registration:

Please note that students will register electronically for classes during the second week in February. You will be able to view their course requests in Parent Portal. You will NOT be able to see the students ACTUAL schedule until they are mailed home this summer by guidance. Any student who is absent will be registered by a school counselor. All students who attend one of our technical centers will be registered at their respective schools prior to February break.

HAPPENINGS AROUND CHS...

APES Students Get Their Feet Wet to Build Understanding

Despite the pandemic and doing our best to follow all safety protocols, the AP Environmental Science class left the walls of CHS behind to open our minds with hands-on fieldwork. With the guidance of the UVM Watershed Alliance, students conducted baseline water quality research on Lake Champlain aboard UVM's research vessel the *Melosira*, then traveled up the watershed to assess the biological, chemical, and physical health of Indian Brook, one of many tributaries to the Lake.

Led by Rhonda Mace of the Chittenden Solid Waste District, we explored first-hand what happens to our waste when we're "done" with it as a way to critically analyze how our own choices and actions - from what we purchase to how we dispose of it - impacts the environment from "cradle to grave."

And, to better understand population dynamics, we worked with Chittenden County Forester, Ethan Tapper, to assess the impacts of the invasive LDDs (formerly known as gypsy moths) on the CHS forest and Monarch Watch to rear, tag, and release monarch butterflies to help assess the global status of this threatened species.

It was a busy fall, and more learning adventures await this spring.

SAT BOOTCAMP




