

To sign up for our conferences:

- 2. On the next page you will be asked to enter in your student's name(s), your name, your email address, and phone number. Remember to hit the submit button at the bottom of the page.
- 3. From there you will receive an email with a link specifically for the teachers you selected. This link will show all their available meeting times on one page for you to choose from. Select your meeting time(s) and hit the submit button.
- 4. You will receive a confirmation email of your teacher meeting time(s).

NEW ENGLAND ASSOCIATION OF SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES

Colchester High School will be welcoming five members of a NEASC visiting team for a Collaborative Conference on October 27 and 28. This will include class visits, a campus tour, and meeting with representatives from various groups including teachers, nurses, school counselors, support staff, students, and more.

Colchester High School joins approximately 725 public schools throughout New England accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). In total, NEASC represents more than 2,000 public schools, colleges and universities, independent schools, and vocational/technical and career institutions.

Last year, we crafted a self reflection based on evidence including surveys from families, students, faculty, and paraprofessionals. Faculty and administrators examined our data in light of the NEASC standards, and we look forward to continuing the work this year.

NEWS FROM THE SCHOOL COUNSELING DEPARTMENT

Attention Sophomore and Junior Students and Families who have <u>already</u> signed up for the PSATs

Just a reminder that the PSAT will be administered at CHS on Saturday, October 15, 2022 for any CHS sophomores or juniors who have already signed up.

The assessment will start promptly at 8:00 am and end at approximately 12:00pm for the PSAT so students should be at CHS (in the cafeteria) **no later than 7:45am**. In addition, students should come to school well rested, having eaten a good breakfast, with a photo ID, 2 sharpened #2 pencils with erasers and an approved calculator (https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat/taking-the-test/calculator-policy). There will be a limited number of calculators to borrow but this is not the case with most standardized tests like the SAT or ACT so students should bring their own or ask their math teacher for one in advance.

The Odyssey of the Mind teaches students to learn creative problem-solving methods while having fun in the process. For more than thirty-five years, this unique

The new omicron specific COVID-19 boosters are now available for high school aged students!

Who can get the new booster? The

updated booster is for people 12 and older who have completed their primary COVID-19 vaccine series and received their last booster or additional dose at least two months ago.

You can get free COVID-19 vaccines at:

- Your health care provider's office
- A pharmacy (appointments are usually needed)
- Walk-in clinics by local health offices or EMS
- Other locations where you get your vaccines

Don't forget Flu shots! It's best to get your flu shot before the end of October. You can get your flu vaccine and your covid booster at the same time.

CAP/GOWN & DUES INFO:

Seniors will receive cap/gown and announcement information at the **mandatory senior AT on Wednesday, October 12th** with the Josten's representative. Josten's will return on Thursday, November 10th and Friday, November 11th during lunches (11:07-12:55) to collect the orders.

Senior dues are \$20 and cover the cost of the class gift, flowers, and other costs associated with graduation.

Your payment to Jostens for your cap/gown/tassel and any other items you order from Jostens, as well as your senior dues should be paid at the time the order is placed on November 10th or 11th.

PROJECT GRADUATION COLCHESTER HIGH SCHOOL CLASS OF 2023

Next Meeting is October 3rd at 6pm in Room 101 of CHS

Project Graduation began in Maine 40 years ago in response to the tragic loss of 18 lives in alcohol and drug related crashes following graduation. During the 1979 commencement period (<u>May 15-June 30</u>) in Maine, seven of the 12 deaths among teenagers that resulted from driving under the influence of alcohol occurred in the area of Oxford Hills. In response to this loss of life, a school-community coalition from Oxford Hills developed and implemented a program called "Project Graduation," a chemical-free graduation celebration, during the 1979-1980 school year. During Oxford Hills' 1980 commencement period, there were no fatalities, no alcohol or drug-related injuries, and no arrests for driving under the influence of alcohol. Maine's first Project Graduation was such a success that many other high schools adopted similar programs. By 1986, Project Graduation activities were held in fifty states. Today the term "Project Graduation" describes a legal substance free graduation celebration sponsored by the community under the supervision of many adult volunteers.

Our first Senior Sunrise happened on 9/25. The sunrise was beautiful and some of the seniors were able to sign the senior rock..


