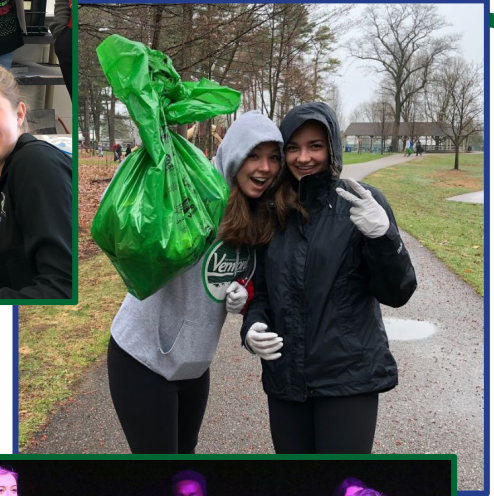

PSAT for Sophomores & Juniors

What is the PSAT/NMSQT?

- The PSAT/NMSQT stands for Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test.
- The PSAT/NMSQT assesses **critical reading** (passage-based reading, sentence completion), **math reasoning** (numbers and operations; algebra and functions; geometry and measurement; data analysis, statistics, probability), and **writing skills** (sentence error identification, sentence error paragraph improvements) that are important for success in college.

The Test

- The PSAT will be administered **Saturday, Oct. 15th.**
- The test is for students in Grades 10 & 11 and is a practice test to prepare for the SAT.
- Students will need to arrive by 7:30am and the test runs until approximately 10pm.
- Students will need to bring a calculator and have ID on hand.

Why Take The PSAT/NMSQT?

- The PSAT/NMSQT is a student's first official step on the road to college. It encourages students to start planning for the after high school by either jumpstarting their college search process, or for some, introducing them to the concept of college.
- On the average, students who take the PSAT/NMSQT score higher scores on the SAT than those that don't. One reason the tests have the same format, questions, sample questions, and question types. Students will get sample practice recommendations from their Academy based on their performance on the PSAT/NMSQT. Students will have access to explanations for the answers to every PSAT/NMSQT test question as well as enhanced online score report.
- PSAT/NMSQT students who meet entry requirements may enter National Merit Scholarship Corporation's scholarship competitions as well as other programs that give special recognition to high-achieving students.
- Student Search Services gives PSAT/NMSQT test-takers the option to receive admissions and financial aid information from colleges, universities, and scholarship programs.
- With the PSAT/NMSQT, students get their first look at how their academic skills compare with those from a national group of college-bound students.
- The PSAT/NMSQT Score Report gives students personalized feedback on their test performance, including
