Dear families,

We are all so thankful to be back in school and making connections with our community. Whether it is in person through hybrid or fully remote it's amazing to be working with CHS students again this year. We were overwhelmed by the generous support we received last year and are hopeful we can have another successful year. CHS cares is thrilled to be thinking creatively around how we can continue to demonstrate care and support to the wonderful Colchester community.

2020 has been a challenging year for many and we anticipate an even greater need for our annual Thanksgiving drive due to COVID 19. This year CHS Cares will be partnering with Colchester Shaw's along with other local businesses to sponsor our annual Thanksgiving Day project. Shaw's has generously agreed to donate turkeys so we are hoping the community can come together to help donate non perishable items, and money to provide 27 families within the district with a complete Thanksgiving meal. There are a variety of ways that you can help.

During the month of November, have your child bring in canned goods and non perishable items and place them in the designated boxes in their Homebase. The last day for donations for Lakers is Tuesday 11/17 and the last day for Champs is Friday 11/20.

Some suggestions include: canned vegetables, canned pie filling, cranberries, rice, stuffing, potatoes, gravy, etc. We will also accept other non-traditional items such as pasta, cereal, peanut butter, tuna, baby food, and soups. Consider even looking in your own cupboards for an extra box of mac and cheese or soup to donate! Every little bit helps. We also accept cash or check donations made out to CHS.

If your company does matching donations, we are a non profit and can help make that happen.

This year we are being thoughtful around volunteers who will be sorting and packaging the boxes in order to ensure continued safety. At this point we will only be having CHS cares members and faculty or staff help with the assembly of the boxes wearing gloves, masks and practicing social distancing.

We are planning a different format for deliveries to reduce contact but will still need some volunteers to help get them where they are needed throughout Colchester. If you would be willing to drive up and have us put the boxes into your car with the directions on where to deliver it, we could use your help. We will be delivering on Friday 11/20/2020 leaving CHS between 3-4:30. We will have directions to the homes and keep them in similar areas. We will be using a sign up genius so please email Kerry to be added.

A chance for families to connect with community experts on a variety of topics. The 4th Tuesday of the month from 6:30 pm - 8:00 pm via Zoom.



In honor of Dia de los Muertos (Day of the Dead), the Library created this ofrenda (altar) honoring Ms Barnes' relatives that have passed. "Ofrenda" means "offering" and is a significant part of the celebration as it brings us closer to loved ones who have passed away. Ms Barnes grandmother is at the top of the altar with other relatives on other levels, including her Dad. The ofrenda includes orange marigolds to lure souls to the earth, photos and keepsakes of loved ones, "papel picado" (paper banners) to represent wind and fragility and the traditional sugar skulls known as "calaveras" to remind of the shortness of life.


The deadline for ordering cap/gown from Jostens' is December 1st, 2020.

GREETINGS! My name is Danielle Jatlow, and I'm the Director of Community Health Initiatives at Centerpoint. I've been working with adolescents and families of adolescents for over 20 years—in San Francisco, New York City, and (for the past 10 years) in Vermont. I recognize there is no "one size fits all" approach to parenting and that adolescence is a stage of development characterized by change and transition—and this change and transition has meaningful impact on an entire family. For many (most), the overlay of COVID- 19 has made the joys and challenges of parenting adolescents even more complex.

Centerpoint is partnering with Colchester High School to provide family-focused, health and wellness support and resources to parents and caregivers. CHS Parents are invited to reach out to me to ask questions, explore developmentally-matched parenting skills and strategies, learn about community resources, or just have a space to share about parenting adolescents.

Additionally, we have developed the following opportunities this Fall/early Winter:

- OFFICE HOURS: In person, by phone, or by Zoom every Wednesday from 2pm-2pm.

Youth Environmental Summit - Perfect for Remote Learning Days! (grades 6-12)

Take a sneak peek! Our annual Youth Environmental Summit will happen this year, but with a twist. This year's Summit will run for three weeks with a kick-off on Friday, October 30, 2020 and stay open until Nov. 20, 2020. This will allow youth to attend when it works with their schedule - perfect for remote learning days - so sign up your entire class, green team or encourage youth to attend on their own! Using Flipgrid we are building a virtual community learning space with keynotes, workshops, "Be the Change Audio Wall" and more to make sure the sharing, learning and networking that usually happens at YES will still happen. TRY for the Environment - Apply to be a Teen Teacher! (grades 7-12)

TRY stands for Teens Reaching Youth and is an environmental leadership opportunity for students in grades 7-12. It is an environmental education program taught by teens and designed to increase environmental literacy and responsibility in younger youth. **NEW for 2020-2021:** Due to Covid-19 restrictions, the TRY program will be limited to two content areas - **4-H2O** and **Waste Solutions**. Each content area will consist of three, 45 minute lessons that are **designed to be delivered virtually** - either when students are in the classroom or at home. We will offer the TRY teaching opportunity to teens twice - Session 1 (January - March with training in December) and Session 2 (March - May with training in February). All trainings and program delivery will be virtual; **Session 1** <u>applications</u> **are due by November 2**.

4-H Speak Up Contest - Youth Voice Matters! (grades 3-12)

This November our country will vote and elect people to lead at all levels of government (i.e., local, state, national). While citizens younger than 18 do not have the right to vote, their voices matter! Part of **civic engagement**, a key mission of the 4-H program, is helping young people use their voice to drive change in their communities. The 4-H Speak Up contest asks youth to **create a video** (2 minutes or less) and **answer the question:** What is one thing you would do to improve your community and why? 
