

Dear CHS Families,

It is hard to believe, but we are officially half-way through the 2020-2021 school year! Last week marked the end of Quarter 2 / Semester 1 and the start of Quarter 3 / Semester 2. For most students that meant a significant change in their class schedule. We will be mailing Q2/S1 report cards home next week. As always, please let us know if you have any questions or concerns.

This time of the year also marks when we begin our process for course selection and registration for the next school year. On the following page we have outlined our timeline and process for 2021-2022 course requests and registration. Here you will find information about the process for students to review the CHS Program of Studies with their HomeBase teachers and register for courses for 2021-2022.

HomeBase teachers have already begun guiding students through four HomeBase sessions. These HB's are designed to provide the "thinking" time for course selection. The electronic registration process is the mechanical component to registering for classes, which will happen during the last of the four Homebases.

On another note, one of the many things that happen in schools across Vermont (and the country) during most springs is the administration of standardized tests. Students are required (by state and federal law) to take standardized tests in English Language Arts (9th grade), Math (9th grade), Science (11th grade). We are waiting to hear the status of testing this school year from the federal government and state. We will likely have more information for you in the next View.

On Tuesday, March 2nd we will be holding **Family-Teacher Conferences**. Our conferences will follow a similar format to fall conferences. All conferences will be virtual. Conferences will take place on **Tuesday**, **March 2nd** from **10:30am- 6:30pm** and will be 15 minutes long. Please be on the look-out for an email from your student's teachers over the next two weeks inviting you to schedule a Zoom conference with them on March 2nd.

SCHEDULING 2020-2021

Lakers: January 25, HB: Program of Studies and Talking Points: Champs: January 28 HB: Program of Studies and Talking Points: The purpose of this is to provide time for students to read and review the CHS Program of Studies.

During this Homebase teachers read and review with students "Talking Points" from each department area. The talking points highlight key points that students need to know about each department's course catalog.

Lakers: February 1: HB: 4 Year Credit Check and A/B Day Grid: Champs: February 4: HB: 4 Year Credit Check and A/B Day Grid: The purpose of this HB is to give students the opportunity to review their CHS transcript.

Reviewing the transcript is important for two reasons: it allows us to catch computer errors, as well as reminding students of what they have already taken. As students review their transcript they will work with their Homebase teacher to complete the 4 year credit check form. It is very important that students have time to review the transcript and complete this form prior to course registration as it helps your student determine what courses to take for the following year.

The paper forms are designed to make the online registration easier. It also provides think time to students so that when they are ready to electronically sign up the process is more efficient and accurate

Please note that students will register electronically for classes during the third week in February. You will be able to view their course requests in Parent Portal. You will NOT be able to see the students ACTUAL schedule until they are mailed home this summer by guidance.

Any student who is absent will be registered by a guidance counselor. All students who attend one of our technical centers or are a virtual learner will be registered by their school counselor virtually during the month of February.




STUDENT DEBT
