

Dear CHS Families,



Dear Colchester High School Students and Families,

Colchester High School is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). The NEASC process includes: "self-reflection, peer review, school improvement, and monitoring to ensure all students experience a high quality education." George Edwards, Director of NEASC states, "Accredited public schools are dynamic learning communities where teachers, administrators, staff, students, and parents are committed to the ongoing pursuit of the highest quality education."

As part of the accreditation process, CHS is completing a Self Reflection. Students, families, and faculty members will complete surveys designed to provide our school with important feedback on our work. In order to deliver great teaching and learning, it is important for CHS to collect student and family feedback. We hope to learn more about what is working well for our students and identify areas for growth and improvement. Students will have an opportunity to complete the survey during Homebase on Friday, Nov. 12. Students not present on the day the survey is given or students not enrolled in a Homebase, can access the survey through the link we will email them on Friday, Nov. 12.

Parents/guardians will also be surveyed. We ask that every family complete one survey. You do not need to complete multiple surveys if you have more than one student in the school. The survey can be completed on a computer, tablet, or phone. You do need to complete the survey in one sitting as your answers will not save until you hit submit.

Giving thanks BASKETS Etc. Dear Families,

Having the hustle and bustle of all our students together again has brought a new energy to CHS. We had lofty goals for our drive last year during the pandemic and we far exceeded them, thank you to our generous community. CHS cares is thrilled to have all hands on deck this year to support giving back to our community.

This year CHS Cares will organize "Giving Thanks" baskets to honor all that we are grateful for and to give back to those who may need a little extra. We will again be partnering with Colchester Shaw's along with other local businesses to sponsor a food drive for 27 families in our community. There are a variety of ways that you can help.

We are happy to accept cash or check donations made out to CHS but items would be the most helpful due to concerns around items being stocked.

We are planning to utilize a similar format to last year for deliveries. We will need some volunteers to help get them where they are needed throughout Colchester. If you would be willing to make a delivery of the boxes of food with the directions on where to deliver it, we could use your help.
