Dear Students & Families,

On Saturday, May 21st, Colchester High School will hold its annual Junior/Senior Prom at The Hilton on Battery Street in Burlington. The event will be staffed by the junior and senior class advisors, CHS Administrators and teachers, and the Colchester Police. In order to ensure that this event is safe and successful, I would like to share with you our guidelines.

- The Prom starts at 7:30 pm and ends at 10:30 pm. The doors open at 7:30 pm and close at 8:30 pm. Students will not be permitted to enter after 8:30 pm.
- Tickets will go on sale in the CHS Attendance Office on Tuesday, May 3rd.
- All tickets MUST be purchased in advance for \$40 per student, CASH ONLY. Each student must purchase his/her own ticket.
- If your student plans to invite a student from another school, they must obtain approval from administration. No guest applications will be accepted after Wednesday, May 11th. No individual over the age of 21 will be permitted to attend.
- Students may not bring food or beverages into the prom.
- No backpacks are allowed under any circumstances. Students are only
 permitted to bring a small handbag or purse into the prom. Please be aware that
 all bags are subject to a search before the student is allowed into the prom.
- Any student suspected to be under the influence will be administered a Breathalyzer by the Colchester Police Department.
- If a student chooses to leave the dance, they may not return. No exceptions.
- Dress Code: The Prom is a formal dance. All students must wear appropriate formal attire. The Prom theme for 2022 is "Enchanted Forest."

OPPORTUNITIES SHARED WITH THE SCHOOL COUNSELING DEPARTMENT

The Greater Burlington YMCA is offering the **opportunity for one high school junior (rising senior) to serve as Youth Governor from Vermont at a national YMCA Youth Governor's Association meeting in June**.

The Youth Governors Conference will run June 12-17 and takes place in Washington, D.C. There is no cost to the selected Youth Governor, with all expenses (travel, hotel, conference/activity fees, and meals) covered by our Y and Y-USA. At the conference, Vermont's Youth Governor will meet and work with youth leaders from across the country.

The selection of Vermont's Youth Governor is the **first step** of what we see as an exciting year for the Y in Vermont and the creation of a Vermont YMCA Youth Cabinet of up to 10 additional positions.

In addition to attendance at the June conference, we are looking to work with the selected Youth Governor to stand up this new (at least in recent years) YMCA Youth in Government program in Vermont. With guidance from the Greater Burlington YMCA and national YMCA resources, the Youth Governor would work with other youth leaders from across Vermont to develop a policy agenda and advocate for legislation that advances that agenda. This would entail:

- Participation in 3 virtual cabinet meetings throughout the year (fall, winter, and spring).
- Collaboration with cabinet members to develop a youth policy agenda for Vermont.
- Development and implementation of an advocacy strategy that advances the policy agenda.
- Presentation of the policy agenda to state officials and legislators.

The deadline to apply is May 10th. (*Important: The May 4th deadline seen on the application does not apply to the VT applicants.*)


