It has been a busy first two weeks of school and it all started with our Cougar **Community Night** last Monday! Afterwards, time was allowed for meeting all the teachers on the core teaching team as well as all our support and Unified Arts teachers. Wednesday we welcomed **all 500+ of our students to school for the first time** together this year. Since that day we have spent time in extended TA each morning getting to know each other and building community. TAs and teams have also worked on setting norms which will be used to determine our **school wide norms**. By the time you receive this newsletter we will have our CMS schoolwide norms set. This will be accomplished by each team sending a student representative to a **school "summit"** in which the representatives will work together to synthesize each team's proposal for norms into our final school wide norms. These will be the norms by which we will conduct ourselves and live by as CMS community members. We will be sure to share these norms with you in our October newsletter.

This year, all our staff are being trained in a program called **Developmental Designs**. This training is foundational to the philosophy of best middle school practice which explicitly teaches us about the needs of our middle school learners and how best to prepare our school and classrooms to meet those needs. The tenets of Developmental Design are fun, competence, relationships and autonomy. Our daily practice of meeting every morning in a circle to greet each other, share about a topic and do a fun activity together are all foundational to building strong community where **all** students can feel accepted and it forms the foundation for an environment in which both academic and social emotional learning can happen. Beyond morning TA, the tenets are carried out in the classrooms in the way teachers and staff are organizing their classrooms, greeting students as they enter the room, using empowering language, and modeling and practicing expectations.

I am looking forward to greeting your children each morning and seeing them engaged in their school experiences throughout the day all year long!
