Accountability

Student learning will be assessed and graded using school and district assessments and grading systems. Students are accountable for their own learning.

Attendance

Daily attendance and learning is expected. Students are expected to participate in community building and learning activities, and to virtually attend school each school day.

Community Building

Students will have daily community building activities - Morning Meeting, Morning Message or Teacher Advisory (TA) to build classroom community and to stay connected to school. Students will be expected to participate in community building activities.

Meals

CSD will provide meals for virtual students in a pick-up location. Meals will be available for those eligible for free/reduced lunch, and for those who would like to purchase lunch. More information will be provided from the CSD Food Service program.

School Calendar

Follow the CSD school calendar. Students begin school on September 8th.

Support Services

CSD will provide support services, based on student needs and plans. Support services will be coordinated with the classroom teacher, support services staff, and the family.

Glossary

Academic Time (AT) - an instruction period for learning acceleration, advising, intervention, and support

Assignment Sheet - a checklist of assignments for the day or week

Asynchronous Learning - instruction and learning that does not occur at the same time or place

Hybrid Learning - learning that takes place in-person at school (2 days) and at home (3 days) . Hybrid Learning in CSD is 2 days at school, 3 days at home

Learning Platform - a set of online tools with learning resources and information (ex. SeeSaw, Google Classroom)

Morning Meeting/Morning Message/Circle Time/Homebase/Teacher Advisory (TA) - community building routines that support social-emotional learning

Office Hours - a scheduled time for drop-in instructional support and or questions, may be virtual or in-person

Remote Learning - learning that takes place at home

Synchronous Learning - instruction and learning that occurs at the same time, but not in the same place.

Vermont Virtual Learning Cooperative (VTVLC) - online collaborative network of Vermont public school instructors and courses

Virtual Learning - learning that takes place at home, that is an option selected by the parents/caregivers

Weekly Learning Plan - an overview of learning for the week, may include links to asynchronous instruction
