Updated Guidance from the Agency of Education

Last week the Governor's Office announced that they would be moving into the next phase of high school winter sports and today marks the first day that teams are allowed to compete with other districts. All home games at CHS will be live-streamed by <u>LCATV using this link</u>. At today's press conference Education Secretary Dan French announced that they have finalized guidelines that will allow for more music to happen in schools, both instrumental and vocal. As soon as we receive official guidance in writing, we will thoroughly review the document so that we can safely implement them in our schools.

Quarantine and Testing Information

As a reminder, the current order from the Governor states that if you gather with anyone outside of your household (not including childcare), everyone must <u>quarantine</u> for 14 days, or 7 days followed by a negative test, as long as you do not experience symptoms. Also, if you <u>travel outside of Vermont, you must</u> <u>follow quarantine requirements</u>. Quarantine means staying home and away from others. Do not go to work or school, or out to do errands or recreation. This helps to prevent the spread of COVID-19 before a person knows they are sick, or if they are infected with the virus and don't have symptoms.
