First Day of School & Calendar

Opt-in to Receive Text Messages

The district and the schools often use text messaging to send reminders, announcements, or alerts that point to an important email (like this one!). If you would like to receive text messages you must opt-in using your cellphone, they are not sent automatically. To sign up for text messages, text "yes" to 67587. Within 24 hours of sending the request, you'll receive an automated confirmation message. You can unenroll from text messages at any time by texting "stop" to 67587.

There were a number of changes this year, including bus number changes on the CMS/CHS routes and some minor pick-up/drop-off time changes on our elementary routes. Keep an eye out for that email!

Vaccine Clinic Tomorrow at CMS

Colchester School District will be hosting three school-based vaccine clinics through the Vermont Department of Health and the Vermont National Guard. <u>The first is scheduled for tomorrow Wednesday</u>, <u>August 18.</u> There will also be clinics on Wednesday, September 8 and Wednesday, September 29.

All three clinics will take place at Colchester Middle School from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm and will be offering first or second dose of the Pfizer vaccine to *anyone* 12 years and older. Free Meals and Additional Meal Benefits for Families Who Qualify

We are thrilled to announce that breakfast and lunch will be FREE for ALL students this school year. Menus are available at <u>www.csdmeals.org</u>. Meals will be available for every student, however, they can also choose not to have a meal. Unfortunately, we will not be selling ala carte items to start the year. We hope to be able to add this option in the future. We know not every student will want a meal and to mitigate wasting food, we are going to make our best guess at how many meals to prepare for our buildings. We thank you in advance for being patient with us as we calibrate our numbers during the first couple weeks of school.

Even though meals are free, <u>we still strongly encourage families to apply for free/reduced meals</u>. The number of families qualifying for free/reduced meals impacts federal funding and services allotted to the students in our district. Approval for free/reduced lunch also allows families to receive additional money through Pademic-Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT) cards. These extra funds are given by the government to families who fill out a free and reduced meal application and are approved. They can then use that extra money to purchase food items at grocery stores, convenience stores, online retailers, and farmers' markets.

Child Tax Credit Information from the IRS

The IRS announced two new online tools to help families manage Child Tax Credit payments; one of three tools now available for the upcoming advance payments:

- New The <u>Child Tax Credit Eligibility Assistant</u> allows families to answer a series of questions to quickly determine whether they qualify for the advance credit.
- New The <u>Child Tax Credit Update Portal</u> allows families to verify their eligibility for the payments and if they choose to, unenroll, or opt out from receiving the monthly payments so they can receive a lump sum when they file their tax return next year.
