Preschool Families,

The Agency of Education is allowing school districts with a public preschool attached to a school to include their preschool students in the Test to Stay Program. This means if your child is identified as a close contact from a positive case in their preschool classroom, they would be eligible to participate in Test to Stay. Test to Stay allows healthy students, with no symptoms, to continue coming to school during their quarantine period by taking a district-administered antigen test each morning. More information about the program would be provided at the time of the exposure. To participate in this program, you MUST provide consent ahead of time.

It can take the state several days to process the completed forms. If Test to Stay is something you think your family would want to participate in, we strongly encourage you to fill out BOTH forms as soon as possible. Filling out the forms doesn't mean your child would have to participate, you always have the choice to keep them home. It just gives you the option in the event your student is ever identified as a close contact.
