

#### **Facilities**


During two school board retreats this summer, George Trieb and I spoke with the board regarding the needs of our facilities district wide. As you can imagine, if we forecast the next fifteen years there are several significant projects the community will need to consider. Items such as: bleachers at CMS, gym floor and boilers at MBS, bathroom/septic at PPS and UMS, cafeteria at CHS, roofs, replacing floor tiles, HVAC concerns at multiple buildings, and more. The simple fact is, our school buildings are aging. This is a key factor that both the school board and the community must begin to consider as we continue to plan long term.



Last year, the district launched a committee to develop a PreK-1 Early Education Center. The School Board would like to thank that committee for their hard work and commitment to the process. I recently delivered a presentation to the School Board regarding my desire to develop a plan to address the needs of our PreK through Grade 2 students. The School Board and I do not believe moving Grade 2 to MBS and having a PreK-1 building will best meet the learning needs of our district. Our intention is to develop a long term plan to address both the **facilities** and **educational needs** of our PreK to Grade 2 learning community.

In a few months, CSD will launch a "NEW" community based committee that will analyze the benefits and challenges of the following building options. The first would be to **build a new facility** that would encompass Preschool to Grade 2. The second option would be to **renovate** PPS & UMS to become Preschool to Grade 2 buildings.

Please be aware that we have NO preference towards either option at this time. I believe we need to fully research both opportunities. As it happens, that research began last week when our architect started



to evaluate the properties at UMS and PPS. I look forward to providing you an update on our progress in a few months.
