Why Support This Budget?

- 1. To support the future for our children
 - -Good parenting + Good schools = Great Opportunities
 - -Colchester a great place to "live, learn & grow"

- 2. No new programs, personnel, or projects (Act 166-Universal Pre-K & will help CSD)
- 3. Cost-only two other budgets were lower-2.68%

4. Class Size is highest in state for districts/SU.

5. High performance on State Test

-Math -Reading -Writing

CHS Graduation Rate: 96% (87% state)

6. Spending Per Pupil: Lowest in Chittenden County (except Winooski)

7. Tax increase on a \$300K home is \$92/yr. (\$1.77/wk.)

- 8. The Colchester community continues to grow with new housing which attracts more families with children. Good schools are necessary.
- 9. CSD receives \$800,000 per year in revenue from other districts (Grand Isle) for tuition students.

10. Cited as a model in the 2011 Picus Report for high performance and low spending. (Dept. of Educ.-VT)


