





FY'17 Educational Spending Per Pupil





Colchester <u>spends less</u> per pupil than <u>ALL</u> other schools in our region.

Even with spending less, our students rank in the top quarter of schools in the county on statewide assessment exams.

HE BALLOT WILL READ:

"Shall the voters of the school district approve the school board to expend \$39,133,767, which is the amount the school board has determined to be necessary for the ensuing fiscal year? It is estimated that the proposed budget, if approved, will result in education spending of \$14,091.75 per equalized pupil. This projected spending per equalized pupil is 5.97% higher than spending for the current year."

NOTE: Please be aware taxes are *NOT* increasing by 5.97%. This ballot language is required per statute.

BUDGET HISTORY:

Five-Year Average School Budget Increase = 3.50%

Five-Year Average Homestead Tax Increase = 3.24%

RUNNING THE NUMBERS:

If a home in Colchester is assessed at \$250,000 the homeowner would pay \$138 more annually or \$2.65 more per week!



HOW DOES INCOME SENSITIVITY WORK?



Example 1

For a home valued at \$250,000, the owner should pay \$3,666 in taxes. If their household income is \$60,000, income sensitivity would reduce their tax bill by \$2,242, making their total educational tax payment \$1,424.



Example 2

For a home valued at \$300,000, the owner should pay \$4,399 in taxes. If their household income is \$70,000, income sensitivity would reduce their tax bill by \$2,738, making their total educational tax payment \$1,661.



Approximately 70% of Colchester homeowners will receive property tax assistance in 2017. That's 2 out of 3 people.
