



VT Property Tax Adjustment Claim

70% of Households Qualify for Income Sensitivity

Qualifying Households:

- Own their home by April 1, 2019
- It must qualify as a "homestead"
- Have lived in Vermont for the full calendar year
- Not be claimed as a dependent of another taxpayer
- Meet "household income" criteria
- Up to \$136,500 for calendar year 2018
- All forms/claims are due April 15, 2019
- Most file when they submit their taxes
