Dear MBS Families,

I hope you have all enjoyed the beautiful weather this weekend! I wanted to share a few updates and changes that we will be making at MBS over the next few weeks.

As Superintendent Minor shared on Friday, November 6th, all CSD elementary schools are working hard to ensure compliance with the distancing guidelines recently updated by the State Agency of Education and the Vermont Department of Health. Throughout the school we are in the process of rearranging classrooms, removing nonessential furniture, purchasing new student desks and making adjustments so our students are able to properly distance. Over the next week, MBS administration will be in touch with individual grade levels about any changes effective November 16th that will impact that grade level as a result of the new guidance. We appreciate your understanding in this process.

The change to the physical distancing requirements is directly impacting our ability to shift any interested students from a virtual classroom to an in-person classroom. Thank you for your patience as we further develop our plans to bring interested virtual learning students back to in-person instruction. If your MBS student is currently enrolled as an in-person learner and wishes to switch to a virtual learning classroom, please reach out to me at jordan.burke@colchestersd.org.

All students should bring their Chromebooks to and from school each day. This is so students can be prepared in the event a class has to to quickly shift to remote learning for a short period of time. Please remind your child to bring their Chromebook and charger to school each morning.

The playground is now open for students. It is still closed in the morning because we are still avoiding mixing cohort groups but students are able to use it during the day.

NURSE UPDATES

This year it's hard to balance our desire to celebrate the holidays with loved ones and the growing risk of COVID-19 infection.
