Here are a few updates for the week ahead:

Our students are close to earning their first school wide celebration! Ask your child what they have done to be safe, respectful, and responsible to earn Oscar fish tokens!

In the month of September, Vermont schools practice safety drills. This week we practiced an evacuation (fire) drill. Next week we will practice a "Clear the Halls" (lockdown) drill and our bus safety drills. We always announce our first drills to staff and students ahead of time so everyone can prepare for our practice. Our first fire drill was held this week and our students did a great job!

The district and the schools often use text messaging to send reminders, announcements, or alerts that point to an important email. If you would like to receive text messages you must optin using your cellphone, they are not sent automatically. To sign up for text messages, text "yes" to 67587. Within 24 hours of sending the request, you'll receive an automated confirmation message. You can unenroll from text messages at any time by texting "stop" to 67587.

## Preschool


Many concepts are taught in preschool using songs and body movement. Using a multisensory approach to learning stimulates the brain in a variety of ways and provides the children more than one way to recall information. They can remember what they saw, what they heard, or what they did. This improves both long and short term memory. One of the songs we have been singing this week is Mat Man. The children love this song. During this activity, the children are practicing listening skills, waiting their turn, working together towards a common goal, remembering the words to a song, naming the parts of the body and what they do, and working through disappointment if they do not get the body part they wanted. This song also improves a child's body awareness, pre-writing skills, and their ability to draw a self portrait. Here is the link to the Youtube video we listen to.
