Dear Families.

As the district has shared, Colchester Schools will begin a Test to Stay Program this Monday, November 15th for students in grades K-12. Test-to-Stay is designed by the Agency of Education with the goal of limiting out of school learning for students needing to quarantine as a result of a school exposure to Covid 19. I encourage you to watch the following Town Hall and/or review the November 4th CSD newsletter that explains more about Test to Stay.

In addition to the details shared in the video and the newsletter above here are some important details about Test to Stay:

- The Test to Stay location in Colchester is the Community Center next to Bayside Park. It will be open from 6:00 am- 8:00 am on school days for enrolled, asymptomatic students.
- If we learn your child has an exposure to Covid 19 mid-day, they will still be sent home that day to quarantine. The following school day enrolled, asymptomatic students are eligible to participate in the Test to Stay program.
- If your child is not enrolled in the test to stay program, during the time their class is quarantined they will complete an asynchronous learning menu and/or learning packet.
- In order for your student to participate in this program, you must register them ahead of time using <u>both</u> of the following consent forms:
