Friendly reminder to keep your child home if they are sick. Thanks for helping to keep MBS students and staff healthy! Rapid tests available at school for students! Give me a call 264-5904 or send me an email: Josie.Lang@colchestersd.org and I'll be glad to send some home in your child's backpack.

I'm hearing from a lot of families that their child has seasonal allergies this time of year. Since many of the symptoms overlap with Covid, it's recommended that you administer a rapid antigen test just to be sure! Did you know you can get Free antigen tests, or LAMP tests (similar to a PCR) from the Vermont Department of Health? The best way to prevent tickborne diseases is to prevent tick bites. In Vermont, tickborne illnesses are most common from early spring through late fall since ticks are most active during warm months.

Take action to decrease your risk of infection. Wear a repellent containing up to 30% DEET, check your body daily for ticks, and limit your exposure to ticks and tick habitats.

Dear MBS Families,

Again this year Malletts Bay School, PPS, and UMS will be using the We Care Elementary Program developed by Prevent Child Abuse Vermont. We Care Elementary is a health education and violence prevention curriculum that meets National Health Education Standards. It is a sexual abuse prevention program that promotes healthy relationships at an age appropriate level for 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students. The focus is on communicating and understanding feelings, understanding personal boundaries, and recognizing boundaries in others. You can see a summary of topics at the bottom of this page.
